NOTES FROM THE PRINCIPAL

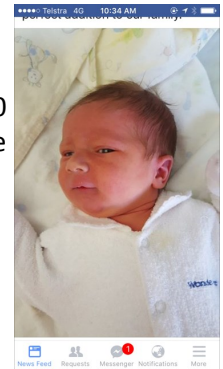
Welcome back to Term 3. I hope that everyone had an enjoyable and relaxing break and ready for the busy term ahead.

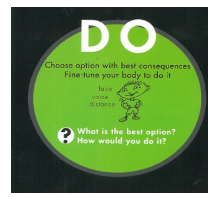
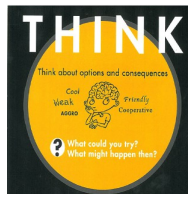
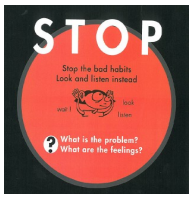
Pam and family were thrilled to see the students so engaged in music and to witness some of their many skills. We hope they will come and visit us again in the near future.

When the prizes arrive, they will be presented at Assembly. Thanks to all the parents who came along to support these students. It was great to see you there.

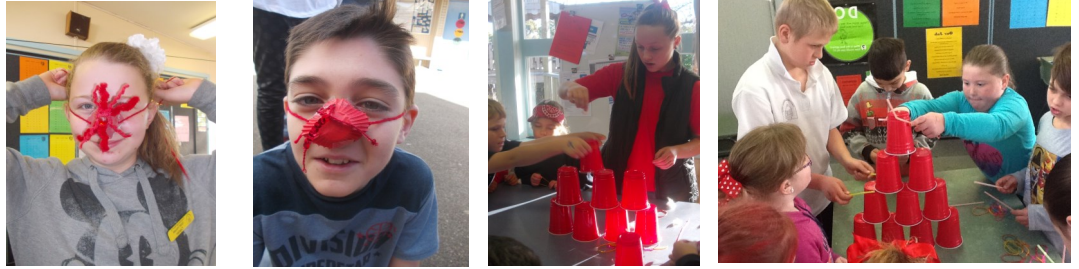


RED NOSE ACTIVITY DAY

The students and teachers at Commercial Road Primary thoroughly enjoyed a 'Red Nose Day' organised by the Junior School Council. This was held to raise money for the SIDS (Sudden Infant Death Syndrome) Foundation.

Everyone dressed in casual clothes and wore a hint of red. The students took part in multi-age group activities such as the 'Cup Building Challenge', 'Pin the Nose on the Teacher', 'Create Your own Nose' and 'Red Nose Biscuits'. At the end of the activities, a parade was held with the students wearing the red noses they had made.

Every year in Australia, over 3,500 families experience the sudden and unexpected death of a baby or child. Commercial Road Primary was pleased to raise \$187.50 for SIDS which aims to find a way to prevent these losses.
