UEDUCATEUS ANNOUNCEMENTS

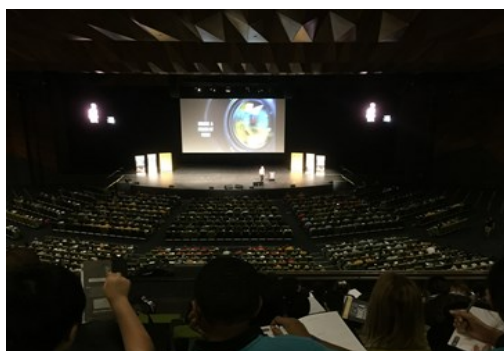
Last week an instruction sheet that detailed each step needed to set up your smart phone to receive messages and announcements from school was sent home.

Nathan Want was the first speaker for the day. He represents the Halogen Foundation as their 'Foundational Leadership Speaker'. Nathan was very inspiring as he talked about how he had previously spoken to young people while encouraging them to keep going through tough times and never giving up. He spoke about how we could also become great leaders.

Dylan Parker was the second speaker and was a star in the movie 'Paper Planes'. He taught the actors in the movie how to make and throw the planes. Dylan has made thousands of paper planes and can throw them really far. He came third in the paper planes World Tournament with his own creation called 'The Raptor'. Dylan is a great leader!

The third speaker for the day was Harry Baker. He is a great poem writer and has won the World Poetry Slam Competition.
